The Heart of Ministry/Entering the Mystery

The last week of January, Cricket and Geoffrey took continuing education time to attend a two-part conference designed to help parishes create inviting and dynamic worship that "stirs the senses and opens the heart."

Gathering at the University of the South, participants from across the country (and New Zealand!) learned how we can become more aware of God's transformative presence through contemplative practice.

The midpoint of the conference was a worship experience of Holy Eucharist that thrilled the senses. We walked the "Via Sacra" and prayed and meditated with poetry, icons, candles, found objects, and myrrh

oil. The music was traditional, but with a different feel. We all learned what an oud was and how it sounded.



MUSIC AT REDEEMER

Following Isabelle Demers' incredibly beautiful organ playing last month, masterclass



and successful CD launch, this month we have two ensembles that feature string instruments, instruments that sound particularly beautiful in our space. On Saturday, February 1, 5pm, the Heimat Quartet join us to perform music that helps us celebrate the 250th anniversary of Beethoven's birth. String Quartet No. 2 in G major, Op. 18, No. 2 was written in the final years



of the 18th century, this early work from Beethoven's first set of quartets is rooted in 18thcentury style. According to Steinberg, "In German -speaking countries, the graceful curve of the first violin's opening phrase has earned the work the nickname of "Komplimentier-Quartett," which might be translated as 'quartet of bows and curtseys'." Mendelssohn's Quartet No. 2 in A minor, Op. 13 was composed in 1827 when he was 18. This work is one of his most passionate works, and is one of the earliest and most significant examples of cyclic form in music. The



Heimat Quartet was founded during the fall of 2014 in Boston, Massachusetts and is currently affiliated with Shenandoah Conservatory. Highlights from their last season include the quartet's Carnegie Hall debut.

On February 15th, 7pm, Kassia Music return to provide an exciting stop on the music mash-up time machine with "Romantic & Neo-Romantic" with a new piece by Sam Post, "Two Pieces for the Left Hand Alone", Brahms, Clarinet Sonata No. 1, and Gernsheim, String Quartet No. 2.

These two Music at Redeemer events will feed us through the remainder of Epiphany and into Lent.

Kairos Prison Ministry International, Inc.

"Listen, Listen, Love, Love"

Kairos is a Christian faith-based ministry focused on the spiritual needs of incarcerated men, women, youth, and their families. By sharing the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ, Kairos hopes to change hearts, transform lives and impact the world. Kairos sprang from the Cursillo movement and is supported by volunteers from the 4th Day movements such as Cursillo, National Episcopal Cursillo, Presbyterian Cursillo, Lutheran Via de Cristo, The Upper Room's Walk To Emmaus, and independently ecumenical Tres Dias as well as volunteers from independent and non-denominational churches. Inspired by Christ's call to action in Matthew 25:36, a diverse group of volunteers learn to work together to interact with incarcerated men, women, youth and their families. "Kairos" is a Greek word interpreted to mean God's Special Time for participants to reconsider life choices, embrace healing and allow hearts to be changed. Inspired by Christ's call to action in Matthew 25:36, Kairos Prison Ministry depends on its volunteers to create an environment where lives can be transformed as hearts are changed within institutional walls. At Redeemer, members of this congregation have served as Team Members and Support Team Members. Our young people have created posters and colorful placemats to encourage participants inside. Some have signed up to be a part of weekend Prayer Vigils, and others have attended men's and women's Closing Ceremonies as well as donated to the costs of Kairos weekends.

Now more than ever, Kairos of Maryland needs your help. Several of the above institutions have experienced drastic cuts in their funding and staff and are unsure if they can continue to sponsor a robust Kairos program on the inside. Therefore, we need to step up and supply new volunteers to serve in this ministry. All one needs is a willing heart and a spirit of obedience to play a crucial role in God's ministry of Changing Hearts, Transforming Lives and Impacting the World.
