Church of the Redeemer's Annual Strawberry Festival June 8 from 11am—3pm

Sunday, June 2 to Friday, June 7

The racks arrive and the tables are set up to receive collectables, books, and clothing. Please remember that collectibles should be collectible and not junk. Books should be in good shape for resale. Clothing items must be clean and on hangers. We need lots of volunteers throughout the week to make sure these areas are organized and ready to go on Saturday morning. Bake Sale items made and packaged for Saturday morning.

FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN

Dear Friends,

June marks the end of school, and the beginning of summer. The days are long, and so far, most nights are cool. The fireflies arrive, the neighborhood pools open, and we celebrate our community with Redeemer's Strawberry Festival. Please sign up to participate in one way or another: either on Friday June 7 to pick strawberries at the orchard, or to hull at the Clara Barton Center; or on June 8, for the setup, cleanup, and the inbetween. Welcome our neighbors, have lunch, and top it off with a strawberry something (this year we are adding strawberry cheesecake to the strawberry variations).

The vestry met last week, and we had many conversations about the pews and your reactions to the rearrangement of them. I hope by now that you have taken the short survey that was sent by email. We want to hear from you. We will convene a meeting on Sunday June 16th at 9:15 (between services) to present the findings from that survey and to discuss the ways forward.



Although the vestry acted quickly to approve the new layout, we did not act precipitously; we had floor plans, schedules, and a list of problems this new layout would solve: for example, the organist could not hear the organ because of where the console was placed; the choir could not hear themselves because they were so close to the organ pipes; and the choir, in the transcept, did not feel like part of the community.

Moving the pews was an experiment. It fixed some problems and created others. It got us talking and thinking about our worship space and where we fit in it. We see the nave and the transepts now with fresh eyes. We'll figure out together the next iteration.

Discernment Group at Redeemer: Sunday, June 2, 2019 at 12:15 p.m.

Just a reminder that a group is gathering to practice deep listening and to share the experience of this practice with one another or just in silence together. A small number of interested parishioners met this fall and agreed to meet on the first Sunday of each month at 12:15pm in the adult classroom. There is silent reflection and voluntary sharing of the experience of a daily review. No experience of this practice is necessary, and any curiosity about spiritual discernment of one's path in life may be brought to this simple gathering. We meet for about 45 minutes. We will start reading through the booklet by Lois Lindbloom called "Is That You, God? Cultivating Discernment as a Way of Life" (2007). Marylin has several copies available; they are free. So have a coffee after the 10:30 am service and then meet us for a quiet time.

Celebrate Eastertide by exploring this contemplative practice. Join us whenever you can; you need not have met with us previously.



This summer, we go back to the '79 Prayer Book for our Sunday services. We'll use Prayer A for the Eucharistic Prayer. Geoffrey found that our planning software provides prayers of the people that are written based on the readings for that day. These prayers will be incorporated for most, if not all, of the summer.

The choir won't be with us, which means the center seats are up for grabs! Please sit in those pews this summer. Amma Cricket plans to do some experimental preaching during these next few months. People sitting in these pews makes it easier for her to do what she's hoping to do.

If you have suggestions regarding liturgy and music for the summertime, please connect with Amma Cricket and/or Geoffrey. And, don't forget to go to church if you're away from Bethesda/Glen Echo from June through August.



Worship Assistants are not assigned in the summer. There will be a sign-up board in the Narthex where you can add your name to an open position, and serve the next week. Give a new ministry a try! On-the-job training provided.

What does it mean to be Registered Member of The Episcopal Church of the Redeemer?

- Regularly attend worship;
- Offer yourself in service to the parish community and take part in opportunities for mission and outreach to those beyond the church walls;
- Grow in faith through prayer and take part in opportunities for study and formation:
- Make an annual stewardship pledge in support of the life and ministry of the parish.

Transfer of Membership: If you are already a registered member of another Episcopal parish, you may transfer your membership to Redeemer by completing a transfer request form, which you will then send to your former parish. That parish will send an official letter of transfer to Redeemer. The Office will contact you when your transfer is complete and your name has been entered into the Parish Register.

Reception & Confirmation: If you are not a registered member of another Episcopal parish or are coming to Redeemer from another denomination, you become an official member of the church through the completion of a series of classes and participation in a service of Confirmation or Reception. These services take place twice a year at the National Cathedral. Please speak with Amma Cricket if you would like to be a part of the next series of classes.




